Construction costs: \$7.7 million

Tom Woollam, founder of TF Woollam & Son Pty Ltd, first completed construction work at Rockhampton Airport during World War Two. Later, the company was awarded the contract for construction of the terminal building, opening in 1989. The most recent redevelopment of the building was carried out in stages while the terminal remained operational. A mixture of distinctive colours and materials were used, providing a fresh innovative look to the terminal and a welcoming environment for both travelers and airport staff.
